
achieve high employment levels, especially for youth



## **Horizontal principles**



- Mainstream and targeted actions to support.
  - gender equality
  - > equal opportunities
  - > non-discrimination
- Promote the transition from residential/institutional care to family and community-based care.
- The ESF+ should not support any action that contributes to segregation or to social exclusion.

#### **EMPLOYMENT**

- (a) Access to employment of all jobseekers
- (b) Modernising labour market institutions and services
- (c) Gender-balanced labour market participation, work/life balance,
- (d) well-adapted working environment, adaptation of workers & enterprises, active & healthy ageing

# EDUCATION TRAINING

- (e) Improving the quality, effectiveness and labour market relevance of education and training systems
- (f) Promoting equal access to and completion of, quality and inclusive education
- (g) Lifelong learning, upskilling, anticipating change and new skills requirements

## Thematic Concentration requirements

#### For all Member States



Social Inclusion at least 25%



Support to the most deprived at least 3%



Co-financing rate of 90% for support to MD





## Thematic Concentration requirements



# Support to youth employment - at least 12.5%

- Applicable to MS with a NEET rate above the EU average (2017-2019)
- All other MS: "an appropriate amount"
  - + Commission statement

## Support to tackling child poverty – at least 5%

- Applicable to MS with an AROPE benchmark above the EU average (2017 – 2019)
- All other MS: "an appropriate amount".
  - + Commission statement





Support to the capacity building of social partners and civil society – at least 0.25%

- Applicable to MS with a CSR in this area
- All other MS: "an appropriate amount".

### ESF+ support to children (1)

- > Education and training
  - support to increase access and completion to all levels of education and training
  - targeted outreach and support to individual learners
  - increasing the accessibility of higher education to persons of disadvantaged background.
- Services, social protection and healthcare
  - actions aimed at improving accessibility of products and services, including services for children such as childcare services;
  - fostering equal access to affordable healthcare to benefit vulnerable groups;
  - support the transition from institutional care to independent living community-based services for parentless children and children with disabilities.



### ESF+ support to children (2)

#### > Social inclusion

- measures promoting the social integration of children at risk of poverty and social exclusion
- innovative actions and experimentation aimed at promoting the social integration of people at risk of poverty or social exclusion

#### Material deprivation

- food assistance, including lunches at school
- basic material assistance, e.g. basic educational materials such as school bags and stationery

#### Education and training systems

- the modernisation of education and training sectors
- the development of the competences of education staff
- Fighting child poverty through bringing parents back to work



#### **ERDF** support to children and children's services

- Infrastructure in education, employment, housing and health
- → DI: transition from institutional to small, community-based and family care
- Building/extension of/ access to services: transport, e-services, equipment, assisted housing...
- Regeneration of deprived urban and rural areas; tackling segregation
- Inclusive, non-segregating facilities and services
- → No renovation of institutional facilities or parallel services
- → A close link with ESF+
